Five years of testing a probiotic Abstract Probiotic Bifidobacteria are well described in literature as modulating immune responses via several mechanisms. However, the question "Does this matter?" has proven difficult to answer. To address this, a group of farmers initiated a study of probiotics on farms in New Zealand. This tested a probiotic product in 298 neonatal calves across 3 farms. Control and treated animals were paired for birthweight and birthdate and observed for up to 7 weeks. On 2 of the 3 farms a statistical significant improvement in weight gain was observed in

treated animals . A follow up study over two milking seasons observed that treated animals produced more milk solids in their second season of milking, but not their third. This implied that probiotics can improve growth and production, but the affect varies from farm to farm. It also suggests that these differences in production may not be observed once animals are mature. This led to ongoing work describing mechanisms, developing new products.
