

He Toki training options

Carpentry

Equip yourself with a wide range of carpentry skills needed for employment in the building and construction industries, including the ability to use tools and machinery and interpret drawings. Can lead to: an apprenticeship; employment; further study e.g. degree in construction management, architectural studies; self-employment; business ownership.

Joinery

Learn the fundamental skills required to work in the joinery industry, including how to use hand and power tools, select timber and construct simple items of furniture. Can lead to: an apprenticeship; employment; self-employment; business ownership.

Painting and Decorating

Equip yourself with essential skills for the painting and decorating industry, including how to prepare surfaces, apply paint and wallpaper and use specialised materials to create effects. Can lead to: an apprenticeship; employment; self-employment; business ownership.

Mechanical Engineering Trades

Prepare for a career in mechanical engineering trades by learning essential practical skills including welding, fabrication, machining, fitting and maintenance. Can lead to: an apprenticeship; employment; self-employment; business ownership.

Electrical Engineering Trades

Gain the practical electrical engineering trade skills and knowledge required to prepare for a career as a registered electrician. Can lead to: an apprenticeship; employment; self-employment; business ownership.

Motor Industry Trades

Enhance your opportunities in the motor industry by gaining a range of skills needed in auto workshops and vehicle service and repair environments. Can lead to: an apprenticeship; employment; self-employment; business ownership.

Plumbing

Get the skills to begin a career in plumbing, like assembling, installing and repairing pipes, and how to interpret drawings and make basic components. Can lead to: an apprenticeship; employment; self-employment; business ownership.

Cookery

Can lead to: employment; on-the-job training; further study e.g. degree in information and communications technology; specialisation in areas such as networking or app and game development; self-employment; IT start-up; business ownership.

Prepare for higher-level studies with our six-month certificate in study and career preparation. Can lead to a diploma or degree in: engineering, architecture, construction management, quantity surveying, computing, business, animal care, social work and a range of health-related subjects including nursing, sports science, nutrition and health promotion.
